

OPPOSITION TO NEW SCHOOL BUILDING

There is talk of getting out an injunction against the Bethel township school board to prevent the erection of the proposed new \$16,000 high school building at Olive Branch. J. B. Trumbo, a member of the board, who lives at Donnelsville, is said to be at the head of the movement. It is claimed that 70 percent of the residents are opposed to expending money for a new building being satisfied with the present four-room building in which the high school and two rooms of the grammar grades are taught.

The contracts for the new building are to be let Friday. It is to be a six-room, modern building in every respect with approved sanitary conditions.

Those against the movement claim there is not sufficient money in the fund for the erection of the building.
