

Historic New Carlisle school in jeopardy

NEW CARLISLE, Ohio (WDTN) – A historic Miami Valley high school building was named to Preservation Ohio’s 2015 list of most endangered historic sites.

Olive Branch High School on National Road in New Carlisle is one of 13 on this year’s list.

The school was reconstructed in 1913 after a fire. It is actually making its second appearance on the list having been on it in 2014.

Preservation Ohio says although the building is registered on the National Register of Historic Places, it is suffering from deterioration and water damage. The building is currently used as a warehouse.

The **Olive Branch School Preservation Society** (<http://www.olivebranchschool.org/index.html>) was formed in 2007 to try and raise funds to preserve the school.
